How much biodiversity is in Natura 2000

• Brief description of aims and methods of the study:

The project is commissioned by DG Environment of the European Commission, and concerns an assessment of species (birds, reptiles, mammals, and plants) inside and outside protected areas (Natura 2000). Regarding the plants an analysis will be performed based on random selected vegetation plots inside and outside Natura 2000 sites. By counting the total number of species in 2x2 km grid cells, and counting the total number of red list species (as far as country based digital lists are available) we want to prove that Natura 2000 matters for biodiversity in Europe. Especially with EU leadership of The Netherlands the next 4 years we need to prove that the Natura 2000 network needs to be secured, or even extended, and should certainy not be restricted. No individual releves, nor distribution maps will be published.

Part of the work will also be devoted to the maintanance of the EVA database.
