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General information

The Botanic garden opens at 8.00 a.m. and closes at 6.00 p.m.

There is a phone-cab near the parking place. In the same area there is a lavatory-toilet . An other lavatory-toilet is situated groundfloor in the small building on your right along the path on your right starting from the Arancera, the room of our Workshop.

EXCURSION

Please, confirm the names of participants to the excursion of Sunday March 16th, included accompanying persons, during the sessions of Friday. Later, it will be not possible to accept further inscriptions. Transport expenses are covered by the University of Rome, the ticket to visit Villa Chigi ar Ariccia costs lit. 7.000.

We will visit the Villa Chigi's Park too. Recent heavy rain damaged the Park, for this reason the authorities need from us a formal declaration of our own responsibility.

After visiting the Villa and his garden at 12.00 a.m. there is a possibility to have a little lunch (sliced pork, cheese, bred and wine/water) at Ariccia. This light lunch costs lit. 10.000 each. Who prefers to bring the own meal can even come with us paying a little ammount for the place in this pub. If somebody has to take his train/plain in the afternoon, has the possibility to take a public bus from Ariccia (one every hour) up to the Metro Anagnina-Termini in Rome. The excursion will start at 8.30 a.m. from the corner Lungotevere Farnese e Salita del Buonpastore (along the Tiber close to Centro Spiritualità). Return in town is planned at 6.00 p.m., but may be delayed depending on traffic. The ammount of 17.000 lit. (7.000 + 10.000) and the signatures will be collected friday at the Workshop secretary desk.

MEALS

At Friday and Saturday a lunch is offered by the University of Rome in the Botanical Gardens at 1.00 p.m.

It is possible to have dinner in the Centro Spiritualità (you can book and pay it at the hotel Reception) at 19.00 p.m. at the price of 15.000 lire. On request of the Direction of Centro Spiritualità it should be reminded that it is not possible to renounce to the reserved dinner at the last moment which will be billed in any case.
