EUROPEAN VEGETATION SURVEY 8th WORKSHOP 19-22 MARCH 1999

Minutes from the Round-Table Discussion 21 March

99.1 Present: Bergmeier, Bruelheide, Brullo, Carni, Chytry, Diekmann, Dimopoulos, Doyle, Dring, Ermakov, Ferro, Fosaa, Gangali, Giglio Ingegnoli, Guarino, Hennekens, Igegnoli, Jandt, Kloetsli, Koci, Krasser, Kucera, Luchese, Moravec, Mucina, Nakhutrishvili, Pedrotti, Pignatti, Poli Marchese, Rasomavicius, Redzic, Rodwell, Schaminée, Seliskar, Spada, Theodoropoulos, Tichy, Ubrizsy/Savoia, Vres.

- 99.2 It was agreed that the organisation of the 1999 Workshop was better than in 1998 but some further improvements were proposed for 2000.
- 99.3 A single theme should again be chosen but with only about 12 papers in total on this subject, each allowing time for questions and discuss.
- 99.4 A keynote speaker should be invited to set the scene for consideration of the theme.
- 99.5 There should be a session on methods with at most 4 papers and brief reviews of national programs.
- 99.6 There should be a poster session but this should also run through lunch on the second day.
- 99.7 There should be small software demonstration run in parallel to the posters.
- 99.8 The chosen theme for the 9th Workshop is to be Dry Grasslands
- 99.9 Because of the Year 2000 Jubilee, the 9th Workshop cannot be in Rome. It was generally agreed that there should not be a break in holding the Workshops and Sandro Pignatti's suggestion of Palermo, Sicily, as a location was agreed.
- 99.10 The dates of the 9th Workshop will be Thursday 6 to Monday 10 April, 2000.
- 99.11 It was agreed that the same Organising Committee (Pignatti, Mucina, Schaminée, Eilertsen, Rodwell) should make arrangements for the 9th Workshop.
- 99.12 The same general timetable as last year was agreed: First Announcement at IAVS Bilbao in July 1999, titles and abstracts to Rome by October 1999, Second Announcement with programme by December 1999.
- 99.13 It was agreed to publish the proceedings of the 8th Workshop in Annali di Botanica. Manuscripts should reach Rome by the end of May 1999.
- 99.14 The Overview of Alliances was nearing completion and an approach would be made to Opulus Press to discuss publication. It was agreed that the Overview will not be posted on the Web until after publication.
- 99.15 Following Sandro Pignatti's proposal, Rome will develop further the syntaxa descriptions on the Internet and make proposals for redactional standards.

Some

- 99.16 It was agreed to develop a standardised framework for parameterising syntaxa that would be compatible with the EUNIS proposals. John Rodwell will circularise an outline framework by email for comments and suggestions.
- 99.17 Frank Klötzli proposed that in future meetings we should take account of issues such as supra-continental syntaxa, biomes and impacts of global change.
- 99.18 The Organising Committee thanked Andrea Savoia and all those in Rome who had helped Sandro Pignatti organise another successful Workshop.
